

1. How many years have you been a member of AFERM?








3. What occupational field do you primarily work in?






5. How many AFERM Luncheons events have you attended in the last 12 months?





9. What can we do to get you more involved in AFERM?


- For #12 below I prefer to attend in person. If I were not local I would definitely attend virtually but would expect a discount.

- Increase the number of training events.




10. What do you like the most about being a member of AFERM?


12. If offered the opportunity to pay for virtual attendance (online, live streaming) at the annual AFERM Summit, how likely are you to participate in the 2-day event?






13. If offered a discount on your membership dues, how likely are you to refer a colleague to join AFERM as a member?


